Care for the Earth Give thanks frequently

Respect and support Indigenous sovereignty Learn about treaties

Remember that treaties are the Supreme Law of the United States (Article 6, US Constitution)

Demand that our nation honors its treaty commitments Consider future generations in all your actions

Learn about and reject the "Doctrine of Discovery" Reach out to your Indigenous neighbors

Slow down and listen more than you talk Notice where you are

> Live with gratitude Live lightly on the Earth Work to end global warming

Support renewable energy Stop hydrofracking, dirty coal and uranium mining

Don't co-opt Native cultures or ceremonies Return sacred objects

Read and promote the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) Celebrate Indigenous Peoples Day every October 12th

Learn about the people indigenous to wherever you are Read Native American authors – support Native craftspeople, businesses and events

Remember that all beings (animals and plants) are your relatives not your resources

Appreciate the diversity of nations, cultures and peoples.
